OVERVIEW

The DAAD-funded project "Digitisation of Cultural Heritage" under the umbrella with German UNESCO commission focuses on preserving and revitalising cultural heritage in crisis-affected MENA regions.

Time, erosion, and political conflict threaten many sites, making digital conservation and reconstruction essential. Beyond safeguarding history, the project aims to strengthen tourism and knowledge transfer by exploring how digital technologies, such as 3D reconstruction, virtual experiences, and mobile applications can make inaccessible sites virtually tangible and attract younger audiences.

Researchers and students from Germany collaborate with local partners on real-world projects, fostering innovation and sustainable regional development.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

Our initiative employs cutting-edge 3D scanning, photogrammetry, multispectral drone mapping, and community-based documentation to preserve the marshes' tangible and intangible heritage with urgency. Unlike traditional conservation, digital archiving ensures that even if physical landscapes or cultural practices disappear, their legacy remains accessible for restoration, research, and education. Building on a successful pilot study where we digitized a sample area, optimized workflows, and determined technical challenges, this project will expand efforts to preserve a strategically selected portion of the marshlands and will focus on high-priority zones, capturing:

- 1. Precise 3D models of waterways, reed-built architecture, and archaeological sites vulnerable to degradation.
- 2. Endangered biodiversity, including endemic species and sacred water buffalo herds, is central to the marsh's identity.
- 3. Vanishing intangible practices, from traditional boat-building to oral poetry and water management systems developed over 5,000 years.
